ALUMNI REPORT

Down Markets Place a Hold on Our Campaign Efforts House Corp. Will Re-Analyze Situation Early Next Year

The House Corporation recently studied the potential for a capital campaign to replace our aging house on campus. We had the good fortune to discuss that study with a great many Alpha Tau alumni and would once again like to thank them here for taking the time to participate.

The results of our formal survey showed great enthusiasm and a clear path to success in raising the necessary funds to construct a new house, and accordingly, we undertook serious planning for a campaign. In fact, our confidence was such that we were just within a few weeks of launching a campaign this school year, with the objective of beginning construction in 2011. It was then, however, that current events intervened. Just as the House Corporation was in the final days of preparations to start the campaign, the present global financial crisis burst into the headlines. Owing to the gravity of the situation we paused for a moment to reconsider beginning a campaign now.

After some reflection, we believe that now is not the moment to start our efforts. First, although we are still very confident of the support of our alumni, we believe that a delay will allow some time to see how the crisis plays out and what if any affect it might have on a capital campaign. Second, as you might imagine, it has also been difficult in recent weeks to engage banks for detailed planning. That said, our financial model is built on

conservative ratios and we therefore anticipate being able to secure financing at a later appropriate time.

Given all of the present factors we have resolved to wait until early 2009 to re-analyze the situation. We are hopeful that at that time we will be able to kick off this project. It remains very important to the continuing success of Kappa Sigma on the Georgia Tech campus.



Brother Conrad passed away in January. He served for many years as the treasurer of the Alpha Tau of Kappa Sigma House Corporation. There were a number of years when he was the only serving officer of the House Corporation, so it can be rightly said he held the House Corporation together single handedly. Dick earned a MS from Florida State University and was a CPA. He was President of Richard Q. Conrad, CPA in Roswell, Ga until his retirement. Brother Conrad is survived by his wife Gloria Herring Conrad, son R. Kemp Conrad (Anne) of Memphis, Tennessee, and two grandchildren: Richard Kemp Conrad, Jr. and Elizabeth Campbell Conrad.

Gordon Boutwell, Jr. '60

Brother Boutwell passed away on September 2, 2008. He was initiated in 1957. After receiving his bachelor's and master's degrees from Tech he completed his doctorate in civil engineering at Duke University.

A practicing soils consultant in Louisiana since 1963, Brother Boutwell founded Soil Testing Engineers, Inc. in Baton Rouge, LA in 1974. He served as the firm's president and senior consultant until his death. Brother Boutwell was also an adjunct professor and guest lecturer at a variety of universities.

Brother Wise passed away on October 21, 2008 in Greensboro, NC. He was from Albany, GA and pledged Alpha Tau in 1961. After graduation he was employed by IBM in Miami. In 1973, he moved to Greensboro where he began his career with Custom Business Forms.
