REMEMBER WHEN?

The Story of How We Obtained a Mysterious Picture in the 1960s

Thank you to Ted Haney '61 for submitting the following...

This message is in response to an email I sent to some of the Class of '61 guys about a mysterious picture that came into my possession some years ago. Since some of the names may be recognizable, I hope the statute of limitations has past. **Aubrey Watson '65** seemed to know some of the details, too, so it seemed appropriate to follow his recollections.

I believe this picture and several solitary Confederate generals were "loaned" to us by the Johnny Rebs Restaurant in downtown Atlanta. Those present were Abdul, Nobles, me and my failing memory can't recall the other. This was in 1959 at the second premier of "Gone with the Wind" at the Lowes Theater. It seems like **Jerry Vaughn** was there too. The pictures seemed to appear in our hands as we were leaving the restaurant. To get out of John Rebs one had to walk through

a turnstile to pay your bill. Since I was the biggest I had to carry the subject picture. Nobles didn't carry a general but he had "borrowed" about a dozen raw eggs that he had found. We went from Johnny Rebs to the Lowes Grand to sneak in the second premier, but they kept catching us. A fellow claimed that he was Darrel Zanuck son told us that we could go in at the intermission. That would be no fun, so we had to help Nobles get rid of his eggs. Abdul stole a school bus to drive a couple blocks

The night before, **Al Nobles '63**, **Eddie Brannon '60** (now deceased), Janice DeLozier (the Alpha Tau Sweetheart) and I slipped into the Second Premier Ball that the Governor was giving for the remaining cast of the picture. **Jim Sledge '62** was already there legally and he was not glad to see us.

The brothers at the house saw us on the 11 o'clock news and began showing up at the Biltmore to insure that we were okay. We all helped them to take the flags down the were adorning the walls, including the pure silk Old Guard Flag of Georgia and the pure silk Confederate Battle Flag that stood on either of the governor's desk. I believe the GBI came by to ask us if we knew any thing about their disappearance along with a 200-year-old rocking chair and a fat ash tray named Steuben Glass. The last I heard of the two silk flags and the rocking chair was that they had moved to the Mississippi delta.

This is my recollection of the history of that picture.

He Gives Back to Kappa Sig Because It Gave Something to Him *SUBHEAD: Brad Smith Tells of His Years as a Kappa Sig Brother*

When Brad Smith reminisces about his days at Kappa Sig, Greek Week, and the pet goat, Wilbur that he and his brothers shared are just a couple of things that come to mind.

Brad and **Mike Malone '81** bought Wilbur at a livestock auction and tied him to the back of Smith's pickup truck.

"We were going to BBQ him, but the moral of the story is never give one of your next meals a name," he said. "Wilbur became like a pet for a few months until the alumni got upset over him eating our shrubs and the campus police tired of us letting him get loose and scaring the librarians on the hill. I brought him to a farm in Carroll County to live out his days."

During his days at Kappa Sig, Brad coached the "Greek Week" team to one third place and two second place finishes. Although he said it's not too hard to believe, his brothers also placed well in nearly all of the events requiring them to chug beer as part of the athletic competition. Things were different on campus back then, Brad said, remembering that the legal drinking age was only 18.

Brad joined Kappa Sig because the brothers

there made him feel welcome "right off the bat." He and his big brother, **Bob Leonard '78**, had a high school motocross connection. Brad remembers hanging out with Bob and some of the other brothers before school or fall rush even began.

During his years living at the house, Brad remained active as a member, devoting his time to the fraternity and his school work. He lived in Carrollton for half a year where he completed a co-op with the Southwire Company.

As an alumnus, Brad continues to visit the house on football game days. He said it

is great not only for the alumni but for the undergraduates to have the tailgates moved to the front lawn of the house.

Brad reunited with pledge brother **Ridgely Cinquegrana '80** at last year's Homecoming game and has attended many games with **Chris Addleton '82** over the years. He has frequently hunted with brothers **Chris and Kurt von Bories** over the last 30+ years.

This is a picture of our second place finish in the 1965 IFC Sing reveal a side of Alpha Tau that wasn't nearly as well known as our athletic prowess. Pictured from left to right are **Milton "Skip" Miller '65**, **Mike Milot '68**, **Dick Blessey '66**, **Mac Anderson '67** and **Don Batchelor '67**. I can't remember what song we sang, but it was a popular folk song from that time. It might have been (the answer my friend is) "Blowing in the Wind" by the very successful trio of Peter, Paul and Mary. Skip Miller would probably remember.

Our group came together initially just to sing for fun in the dorms. Fitting all of us in one of those very small Alpha Tau dorm rooms was a feat in itself. The late and multi-talented Don Batchelor was the arranger/organizer. Don not only gave the rest of us our parts, but he could demonstrate them for those of us (like me) who were less

musically talented. The other key to our success was Skip Miller's beautiful lead voice. Dick, Mike and I performed our roles as assigned by Don.
