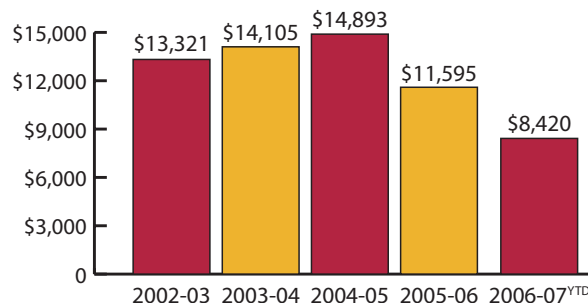

Tennessee Rehabilitation Center in Smyrna, TN two days a week. Except for the loss of some leg functions I'm probably in better shape than I've been in 30 years.

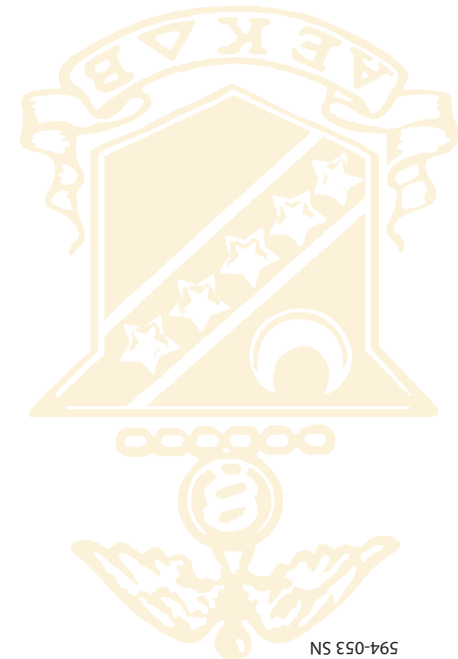
