# **House Corporation Begins Feasibility Study**

Kappa Sigma Plans to Build a Competitive Edge on Campus

For the past several years the House Corporation has watched as other fraternities on campus either built new or renovated their houses. Our house has been a great asset and all of us have fond memories of our time on campus. However, we recognize that we have to look around campus and compare ourselves to everyone else.

For those who have not been back to campus recently, in the past several years, a number of groups have built new houses including: Theta Chi; Sigma Nu; Kappa Alpha; Sigma Chi; Pi Kappa Alpha; Alpha Xi Delta; Phi Mu and Beta Theta Pi; while others have undertaken major renovations including: Sigma Phi Epsilon and Lambda Chi Alpha. It is our understanding at least three other groups plan to demolish their buildings and build new beginning next year.

As a result the House Corporation has retained The Laurus Group,

www.thelaurusgroup.net, in Atlanta. Laurus will assist with a feasibility study looking at the potential for our organization to successfully raise sufficient funds among our alumni to replace our 66-year-old chapter home which was built in 1952.

"We want to be able to provide a safe and competitive environment for the young Kappa Sigmas who follow in our footsteps," said Mike Dudgeon '89, House Corporation president. "If we are going to be able to successfully replace the house, it's going to come down to us, and our ability and interest to make it happen!"





# The Origin of "The Rock"

Alpha Tau's landmark, the white rock, has graced the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> and Fowler for many years. But it is actually the second rock to occupy that spot.

According to the self-admitted hazy memory of alumnus Larry Dallam '55, the first stone was much smaller than today's rock and rested atop the ground.

It seems that in 1953 the original rock disappeared one night and turned up on the lobby desk of the Administration Building. It was determined that the Delta Tau Deltas were guilty of the deed.



swered, Alpha Tau struck back. A farmer's outhouse was located and ensconced upon the Delts' lawn shortly afterward. A subsequent Delta attempt to bury the outhouse in our yard was intercepted, and the building was returned to the Delt yard, soaked with kerosene and torched. The arrival of the fire department amidst cheers from surrounding fraternities brought a final end to the war.

Today's rock, much larger and firmly planted in the soil is the result of that conflict.

But does anyone remember where the first rock came from? Send us your fondly remembered piece of Alpha Tau heritage and we'll print it for others to chuckle over too.
