
Could This Be Our Best Annual Fundraising Year Ever?

Laird Wadsworth Shull Jr. (January 21, 1945 - May 31, 2010). On Monday, May 31st Laird W. Shull Jr.'s life was cut short by cancer. He was 65. His dry humor and charm will be sorely missed by all. Laird, also known from childhood as "Laddie", was born and raised in Richmond VA, graduated with honors from Thomas Jefferson High School, then attended college in Atlanta becoming a passionate "Ramblin' Wreck from Georgia Tech". He graduated with his B.S. in 1974 while simultaneously working and raising a family. He still found time for fun and was a proud brother of the Kappa Sigma fraternity. As a passionate alumnus, he was often seen at Tech games and the fraternity house throughout his life. He worked for

Eastern Airlines from 1965-1990. Following the collapse of the airline, he worked for Northwest Airlines for 15 years before retiring in 2006. By working in these two jobs alone throughout his life, Laird demonstrated the type of dedication and loyalty others often described about him. The airlines took him to several cities: Atlanta, Miami, Fort Lauderdale and Minneapolis. In each town he planted a garden, made many friends, joined the bowling leagues, and adopted the home teams, following teams from the Minnesota Vikings to the Atlanta Braves. He was a modest and kind man who was devoted to his family. He loved his dogs, fishing, gardening, bowling, cooking, music, reading, lighthouses, the beach, electronics and gadgets of all sorts. He loved games and card playing and was often seen during the last few years of his life enjoying his retirement in Las Vegas by playing tournament blackjack and tournament poker. Laird died at home with his family and his dog close by as he wished. He is survived by his wife of 31 years, Beverly, his

daughter Miah Shull Olmsted, two sons Laird Wadsworth Shull III and Taylor Robert Shull, and six grandchildren.
