Building Our Way to Our New Home

Alumni Campaign Contributions Top \$1.7 Million; Your Support Needed to Achieve \$1.8 Million Goal

I am happy to report that the campaign is going very well! New Alpha Taus are coming forward almost daily to support the effort to build a new chapter house. As a result, we have raised more than \$1,716,000 in cash pledges and over \$100,000 of in-kind support through gifts of services. We still need your help! Our goal of \$1.8 million is within our reach, but we will not get there unless new donors continue to step forward.


Your pledge can be paid in several easy methods: by check, credit card, bank draft or stock transfer (monthly, quarterly, or annually, and for up to five years). A pledge of just \$1,000 will gain you recognition on the permanent Donor Wall. That's only \$200 a year if spread over five years. Room naming starts at \$10,000 and a lot of brothers have made that level of commitment or higher.

If you have already pledged to the campaign, THANK YOU! We need your timely payments to pay our commitments. This effort has already consumed thousands of dollars in design fees, and, when construction begins in December, the real expenses start. On-time payments are necessary and accelerated payments are appreciated! We are soon to enter a loan agreement and are counting on your money!

Almost 300 brothers have answered the call to support the campaign. The next donor board will be published at Homecoming, so please add your name to it by filling out the enclosed pledge agreement. With your support, the best fraternity house at Georgia Tech next fall will be the Kappa Sigma house sitting at 182 6th Street!

How We'll Finance Our New House

After a process of vetting several institutions, we are currently engaged in detailed financing discussions with a reputable bank that has



financed a number of fraternity and sorority projects on the Georgia Tech campus over the last several years. Although we are still finalizing the loan structure, the major points are as follows:

- Construction loan of approximately \$3.5 million, which will be split post-construction into two loans: one loan will be the "permanent" house financing and will be serviced by rent, the other loan will be serviced by campaign contributions as pledges are collected.
- The "permanent" loan will have a 5-10 year term with an interest-only period followed by a traditional interest/principal amortization based on 20 years.
- Market interest rate for commercial property.

Follow Our Progress

The construction preparation for the new house is going well. The design for the house is complete and we are very pleased with the

construction documents for the project. The drawings are available for review online at



gtp-eng.com, user name AlphaTau, password 182\$ixth. The job has been put out to bid

to five highly qualified contractors with bids expected back by October 17, at which time we will select the contractor. We are currently in permitting with the city and plan to be ready for demolition of the old house shortly after the final party on December 15 with construction complete the following August.

Moving Forward in Our New Home

This new chapter house represents the culmination of a substantial investment of time and money by Alpha Tau alumni and undergraduates. The house corporation will work to ensure that the house and property are well-maintained as we move forward. In that effort, we are working to draft an updated lease agreement for the chapter and plan to develop a schedule to monitor the level of "housekeeping."


