

Alpha Tau Receives Highest Recognition from Kappa Sigma, Pledges 24 New Members

Alpha Tau Chapter is pleased to report that we received the Founders' Award for Chapter Excellence (FACE), the highest possible award that a chapter can receive from Kappa Sigma Fraternity. Read more about the award on page 4.

We have gained 24 new pledges for the fall 2014 semester —one of the best classes we've recruited—thanks to the use of the new house during recruitment. The chapter boasted a 3.05 GPA for the spring 2014. The chapter also implemented the Star Brother Program, through which each pledge is paired with an older brother in his major as a tutor and mentor.

During the spring semester, brothers donated a total of 2,452.5 service hours (28.85 per brother) and raised a total of \$14,782 for charity. We have also recently volunteered with Atlanta Mission and Open Hand Atlanta. This semester, we will be hosting the first annual Kappa Sigma Games, with all proceeds to be donated to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention.


We are proud to report that the chapter is now 82% ritually proficient, meaning that 82% of active brothers have attained at least one level of ritual proficiency.

A Rewarding Alumni Experience

Drew Philippo '92 Had Unique Opportunity to Lead Construction of New Alpha Tau House, and Credits His Career Success to Kappa Sig Connections

Drew Philippo '92 has had quite a rewarding alumni experience. As the Construction Committee Chairman for the new Alpha Tau house, Drew had an up-close-and-personal way to give back to Alpha Tau and to make a lasting impact on its rich history. Why does he volunteer? "It's a way to give back to the chapter that has so strongly influenced my life," he says. And Kappa Sigma continues to give back to Drew in a big way, too, as his entire career has been made possible thanks to Alpha Tau. He owns an engineering firm with fellow Alpha Tau brother Justin Tracy '95, and has networked with several other brothers throughout his career.

You served as Construction Committee Chairman for the new Alpha Tau house. Tell us a bit about that role.

I managed the construction process from design through construction with the help of my Construction Committee volunteers **Matt Noury '02** and **David Archer**, as well as ad hoc members **Michael Pouncey '94** and **Chris Finke '94**. It was a huge effort but for the most part I really enjoyed it. It was also a great way to get to know some of the older alumni that helped as well as getting to know the chapter, from getting their design input through move-in at completion.

Why do you choose to volunteer as an alum?

It's a way to give back to the chapter that has so strongly influenced my life.
